Resilience in Challenging Times

Many challenges remained in serving the community in 2021 with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The Library began the year with limited hours but continued service through curbside pick-up, virtual programs, and Bookmobile stops.

On February 22, the Library and the Friends Bookstore reopened to the public with capacity limits. The Library slowly and safely added back services and expanded hours during the year. Through the support of Friends like you, the Library was able to meet the diverse needs of the community, whether in-person or from home.

In 2021, 649 families and businesses made 791 contributions to the Friends through your Friends memberships, and donations to the Annual Fund Drive, New Branch Fund, and the Power of Words.

Your support allowed the library to provide:

- Equipment for the Learn and Play Space
- Programs, books, and prizes for the Summer Reading Games
- Take and Make Kits and Book Club Kits

- Funding for special guest library programs
- Patron requests for collections
- Staff development opportunities
- Volunteer Recognition Items
- A Library Innovation grant for Library staff to launch new services, including the popular Role-Playing Game Kits added in 2021

Funding from the Friends supports the Library in their efforts to provide enriching programs, materials, and spaces for the community.



Teen Community at the Library

The Library's engaged community of teenagers stayed connected in a virtual hangout space through Discord where they could talk and play games with one another. The Library welcomed teens back in person with successful events such as Library Loot. Teen-centric needle felting and origami Take and Make Kits proved popular along with a custom 3D printed Role Playing Game Kit, *Under the Warlock's Castle*.

Serving Children and Families at the Library

Due to the pandemic, families faced a number of challenges in educating their school-aged children in 2021. The Library provided support through MLK Day themed Take and Make kits, themed Storytime Kits, and educational kits distributed in collaboration with the IU School of Education's Family Engineering program. Children enjoyed more engaging programming including regular storytimes on Zoom and in local parks, and Harry Potter and Minecraft themed parties.

Summer Reading

- 1,277 children, 458 adults, and 204 teens registered for the summer reading program.
- 114 children and 44 teens collected their prize book.

Accessibility and Inclusion at the Library

In 2021, the Library collaborated with outside community organizations—the Autism Society of Indiana, IU Asian Culture Center, and Bloomington Council for Community Accessibility—to work towards a more accessible and inclusive library environment. These partnerships aided in hosting events and panel discussions focused on accessibility and inclusion, including a virtual Lunar New Year program, two "QueerTalk" programs, the annual Breaking Down the Barriers event, a Library celebration of PrideFest, and a pronoun button making program.

Serving the Adult Community at the Library


The Friends provides funding for adult-oriented programs including Yoga programs, Books On Tap, Take and Make kits like tea blending, the Monroe County Field Notes local history project, and other programs like the successful "Chopped" social media challenge. In 2021, VITAL expanded their services to meet the needs of Afghan refugees and those with dyslexia in the community.

The Friends hosted programs like our popular Coffee with Friends, mostly via Zoom, but ending the year in person:


